

Baptist Union of Wales Annual Conferences 2021

Due to Covid-19, it was not possible to hold the usual Annual Meetings this year again, and therefore a combination of face-to-face and Zoom meetings were arranged.

MOMEMTUM : A Wave of Prayer to "Change the Atmosphere"

A short service to begin the 'Wave of Prayer' took place at one of the earliest Baptist places of worship in Wales on the Gower at Ilston and travelled to 11 different hubs where churches gathered online and in person to pray.

Each of the prayer hubs, received prayers of blessing from the previous hub and sent prayers ahead for the next wave of prayer gathering.

Many of these prayers were transported in a special box made for the occasion and at the final destination in Bridgend the box was opened and prayers from all hubs were shared in the closing celebration on Sunday 27th June.

At this final event, over 160 people representing churches from across Wales, met virtually on Zoom to thank God for the prayers offered, to remember those who had lost loved ones in this past year and to ask God to change the atmosphere in our nation. WELSH LANGUAGE WING "God's Hour is Calling"




The new Welsh Language Wing President, Miss Aldyth Williams, Seion Newydd, Morriston.

Revd Judith Morris, BUW General Secretary, inducting the new president Mr David Peregrine presided at the Miss Aldyth Williams at Seion Newydd, Morriston on June 8th. service at Seion Newydd, Morriston and the opening devotion was led by Miss Meinir George and the Revd **Derek Rees.**

Mr David Peregrine gave thanks for the privilege of serving as President over the past two years and referred to some of the highlights.

The General Secretary was responsible for the Induction of the new President, Miss Aldyth Williams, and the Induction Prayer was offered by the Reverend Eirian Wyn.

Aldyth, a native of Morriston, Swansea, and a former teacher, based her address on the words seen on the clock in the vestry of Seion Newydd, "God's Hour is Calling". These were the words that had extended an invitation to the faithful members for over 170 years. She challenged the congregation to use every opportunity wisely to respond to God's call and urged everyone to accept the invitation and to respond in love with energy and enthusiasm. The service included two musical

items by the organist Huw Tregelles namely 'Prelude Williams, on Rhosymedre' (R Vaughan Williams), and 'March on Nun danket alle Gott' (Sigfrid Karg-Elert).

Before Mrs Sarah East offered the closing prayer, Aled, a pupil from Ysgol Gyfun Gŵyr, was thanked for creating a wooden copy of the clock with the words 'God's Hour is Calling' carved on it.

The service, under the presidency of Miss Aldyth Williams, was held at Carmel Pontlliw, in recognition of the tireless work of its Minister and Secretary of the West Glamorgan Vincent Association, the Revd Watkins.

The opening prayer was offered by the Revd Derek Rees and the devotion was led by the Revd Glandwr Roberts and Mr Trevor Davies.

The General Secretary led a period of reflection to commemorate former Presidents and Ministers who had died during the year, namely Miss Einwen Jones (Former President) and the Reverends W J Lewis, Dr D Hugh Matthews, and John Roberts. A prayer of remembrance was led by the Revd Geraint Morse.

The Revd Vincent Watkins took his text from the well-known verse described as the 'Heart of the Gospel': " For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16). He referred to the richness of the Wonder, Excellence and the Network of God's love. Vincent was thanked for a timely message and the service was closed in prayer by Mr Nigel Davies.

Special appreciation and sincere thanks were expressed to the President, Miss Aldyth Williams, together with the West Glamorgan Association for all the preparations under difficult circumstances. It had been a great encouragement and blessing be a part of the to meetings.

BUW Annual Business Meetings 2021

Challenges and positive news: In presenting the Annual Report at both meetings, the General Secretary, the Revd Judith Morris, referred to the significant challenges facing the Churches as a result of Covid-19. Several churches had already decided that they would not reopen in the future, and it was likely that others would follow. But despite the difficult context, officials had a lot of positive news about the work of the Union and the Corporation.

Vice-President: The Revd Dr Densil Morgan, Vice-President 2021-22 for both wings was introduced and prayer was offered by the Revd Eirian Wyn.

Trustees: Appreciation was expressed for the contribution of Mr David Evans who had completed his term as a Trustee, whilst at the same time Miss Delyth Williams was welcomed as a new board member.

Climate Sunday: Reference was made to the COP-26 conference which would be held in Glasgow in November and the opportunity for all churches to hold a Climate Sunday Service.

Cenn@d: It had been great to welcome the new weekly on-line newspaper published jointly by the Baptist Union of Wales and the Presbyterian Church of Wales.

Ministry: In presenting the Board's report the Revd Marc Owen referred to the students who had been accepted for ministry training, as well as those who had finished their studies. Since the start of lockdown regular meetings had been held through Zoom with our ministers as a means of support.

Mission: The Revd Simeon Baker, Director of Mission, referred to the Mission Training which had attracted a good number of participants during the year, along with the workers who had come from abroad to assist our churches. A partnership had been established with Scripture Union Cymru to try to reach the 95% of children and young people who had no connection with our churches.



Revd Kath Miller: "Pioneer Lead" As part of the Mission Board's plan of work, the Revd Kath Miller has been invited on a part-time basis as 'Pioneer Lead' to develop the Union's response to the context of decline and chapel closure. Kath had been leading the work at New Hengoed for a number of years and was keen to use that experience as a catalyst for new thinking as to how the BUW could discover pioneer leaders for future mission in Wales and to help us find new ways of being church. Kath is currently learning Welsh and will be underpinning her role with a reflect Masters course to theologically and contextually as Baptists in Wales.

Finance: An encouraging report was received from the Finance Officer, Mr Nigel Vaughan who noted that 93% of the churches had paid the Consolidated Budget last year with the same number having contributed for this year. Significant financial savings had been made by holding all the Union's meetings via Zoom which also meant a reduction in the CO2 emissions. Furthermore, a decision had been made not to invest in companies involved in fossil fuels.

The Corporation: It was noted that the Welsh Baptist Union Corporation had celebrated its centenary this year and the General Secretary had invited ideas as to how the milestone could be marked. Glyn Nest Home had celebrated its fiftieth anniversary last year and the Revd Irfon Roberts was thanked for his service as Chair of the Management Committee. Mrs Helen Wyn, the Corporation's Co-ordinator, reported on the sales of chapels, together with a new process introduced to consider the possibility of mission and commercial arrangements for the buildings when a cause ended. Significant financial investment had been made in providing a loan to establish a Mission House in Tonteg. Appreciation was expressed to Mrs Rosemary Morgan on her retirement as a Director of the Corporation.
