Isaiah 35:1-7
& Luke 7:18-23

"So he replied to the messengers, 'Go back and report to John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me.'"

(Luke 7:22-23 NIV)

Devotion

We rejoice this month in the Lord Jesus.... **Healer, Redeemer, and Saviour.** He is the hope of all the ages - past, present and future. He is the hope that the prophets of the Old Testament pointed towards. Isaiah 35 was written in the 8th Century BC, when the people of Judah were aware of the threat of Assyria's armies, as well as Isaiah's serious warnings about the consequences of their sins. In the middle of this, Isaiah points to the hope of the **coming of the Kingdom of God.** Centuries later, the people of Israel had a foretaste of the fullness of that Kingdom in the coming of **the Lord Jesus Christ** (Luke 7:22-23). He came **to heal, to restore, to resurrect and to set free.** The good news is this: the Lord Jesus continues to do those very things today! Are there areas where we need to repent for times when we have "stumbled" in our vision of who Jesus is? (Luke 7:23) Do we need to ask the Lord to open our eyes to see His Kingdom at work? As we do that, where is He inviting us to pray: "Let your Kingdom Come" in our own context?
